Call for Workshops

This year's conference Whova platform enables us to offer a wide range of activities and events beyond our normal range of papers and workshops. We are particularly looking for creative, innovative and participatory workshops that will enhance the programme and contribute towards the overall theme (however broadly).

Please note: A workshop is not simply a long paper! A workshop should involve participants in active engagement, sharing and learning. This can take any number of forms, for example through guided exercises (writing, drawing, meditation or reflective exercises), through discussion and small group work, and so on. We have a poet in residence who will be offering a poetry writing workshop, but there is plenty of scope for more writing workshops and other kinds of creative activity: anything that can be done by a group of people participating virtually on an online platform.

Workshops can be 40 minutes or 80 minutes duration (please specify).

We welcome 200 – 300 word abstracts for workshops.

Please make clear how you intend to involve participants in the workshop, and what the outcome of the workshop will be.

Please state minimum and maximum number of participants to make the workshop viable.

Please submit your abstract as a word document and include your name, affiliation, geographical location (so we can know your time zone), title of workshop and email address, and a brief autobiographical sketch of the workshop leader(s).
