Workshops can be 40 minutes or 80 minutes duration (please specify).

We welcome 200 – 300 word abstracts for workshops. Please:

- **make clear how you intend to involve participants in the workshop, and what the outcome of the workshop will be.**
- **Let us know if you require any particular equipment or type of space state minimum and maximum number of participants to make the workshop viable.**
- **submit your abstract as a word document and include your name, institution, title of workshop and email address, and a brief autobiographical sketch of the workshop leader(s).**
